University of Washington Facilities Campus Architecture + Planning provides comprehensive campus master planning, design review and guidance, space management, public art, capital budget planning, planning and implementation studies, signage and wayfinding, and works with schools and departments on growth planning.

POSITION PURPOSE

Put classroom skills to work on real projects in the context of the Seattle Campus Master Plan regarding development standards, design guidance, access, pathways, parking, and landscape to shape future development and site improvements.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Each potential development site identified in the 2019 Seattle Campus Master Plan has unique improvement requirements and opportunities for the site whether through redevelopment or renovation. This internship will focus on developing graphic and written documentation of this for use by project managers and teams to define future scopes of work. The intern will work with UWF Campus Architecture + Planning staff to design a template to be used, with the goal to complete a comprehensive two-page document for each identified development site.

Example features include but may not be limited to:

- Development standards (e.g. mandatory gross square feet, height limit, view corridors, mid-block corridors, pedestrian corridors, gateways, shoreline district overlays)
- Design guidelines (e.g. pedestrian connections, access, respect to adjacent facilities or features, added features)
- Nature of the programs, services and activities conducted in each building
- Permitting and environmental considerations
- Landscape framework considerations
- Historic preservation considerations
- Site access (e.g. ADA access routes, accessible entrances, Dial-a-Ride stops, bicycle parking, emergency vehicle access, loading/service vehicles

QUALIFICATIONS

- Current enrollment as a junior, senior or graduate student in College of Built Environment or Geography at start of internship
- Excellent graphics capabilities for illustrating features on an aerial/site plan in a reader-friendly manner
- Must have computer access and some access to campus for potential field investigation
- Inherent to success in this position is the ability to anticipate needs, manage proactively, take initiative, work independently, communicate effectively, and exercise good judgment
